

Private Alick WARE



Born at Martin on 9 May 1896 Alick was the eldest son of Samuel and Martha Ware. After leaving school he worked as a porter for the Great Northern Railway (GNR) at Thurlby near Bourne, Southery and latterly at Grimsby where he enlisted into the 10th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment (Grimsby Chums).

During the opening attack against strongly defended German positions at Roeux near Arras on the 28 April

1917 his Battalion sustained more than four-hundred and fifty casualties. Alick was one of those killed in the attack and was just 20 years of age. He is buried at Point du Jour Military Cemetery.
